

A step by step guide to registering Warlander and Warlander Sport Horse

1. You need to be a Member of the Studbook to register or transfer horses.

Payment must be received before a registration can be processed.

AUSTRALIA & NORTH AMERICA: If you reside within Australia and North America 'only' use our bank for payment. For Australia, the bank details are on the last page of the Application for Registration. For North America email registration@wssna.com and you will be sent an invoice. If you do use PayPal by mistake, we will send you an invoice for PayPal fees before your registration is processed.

ALL OTHER COUNTRIES: For ALL other countries use the PayPal option at <http://warlanderstudbooksociety.com.au/forms-payment/> Include your payment advice (date and payee name) if you pay before your send in paperwork.

2. In one email (do not send multiple emails) not exceeding 10 MB return the completed Application for Registration/Membership to registrar@warlanderstudbooksociety.com.au or if in North America - registration@wssna.com

3. Ensure that you use the fillable fields (type into the application) and save it as your horses name. This works best on a Computer, but will also work on Mobile Phones. On Android open with Office, on iPhone open with WPS Office and in both cases click edit to use the fields. For horse body markings scan that page and return separately. If technology fails, write the application but ensure it is clear and readable and each page is no smaller than 500 kb and no larger than 1 mb

In the same email attach the following:

- Copies of sire and dams registration papers. Note, if you do not have these ensure that you fill in their registered names, registered body and registration number along with three generations of pedigree in the Application for Registration/Membership.
- A DNA Parental Verification report or request kit if in North America
- An equine colour test if the horse is outside of normal colours (Chestnut, Cremello etc.)
- Four (4) images of the horse standing square showing both sides, front and back. Supply images in JPG format not exceeding 3 MB in file size each and no less than 1 MB in file size each

DNA PARENTAL VERIFICATION EXPLAINED

DNA Parental Verification is required for Main Studbook Registration and is a genetic test involving three (3) horses, the dam, sire and progeny to prove the progeny came from those parents.

If you require WSS to obtain DNA markers from other studbooks, a registration must be in progress before we will secure them.

Once you have the DNA material or DNA reports for the three horses, or use a testing facility in your country (USA and Canada - UC Davis, Australia - Practical Horse Genetics etc.) and supply WSS with the final report. The contact details for these testing facilities are on the Forms and Payment page of our website.

If you are in North America you can request a DNA Parental Verification Kit and the studbook will do the work for you.

If you can't obtain DNA proof for your horse it can still be registered in the Auxiliary register and will receive the same benefits including Assessment, Premiums and Breeding Approval. However, it will not be able to receive a Passport which requires DNA Parental Verification

IMAGES OF THE HORSE

Images are compulsory and form part of the horses identification and also appear on its page on the online genealogy.

Supply high resolution JPG images as an attachment to the email. Do not crop your images; send us the raw image without editing.

Ensure that the horse is standing square with its neck straight and no bits of the horse are chopped off (hooves, ears etc.). Ensure that you have good light with the sun behind you. If you are using a handler, ask them not to be too close to the horses head. You can take images of horses free (foals) and we understand this can be tricky so do your best and try to capture them standing square with neck straight on all four images.
